#### Reading

#### Reading

- 1 Read 'Rain Before Rainbows' What do you think the message is? What can we learn from this story? https://stayhome.walker.co.uk/rainbows/
- 2 Read '<u>The Rainbow Serpent'</u>. What happened in the story? Why do you think the snake was called the rainbow serpent? Why do you think she was tired? Do you think it was a good idea that the Rainbow Serpent made rules that people had to live by?
- 3 Read the information about <u>'Kenyans'</u> and see if you can answer the retrieval questions. Make sure you read each carefully.

#### **Writing**

- 1 Watch Why Elephant has a Trunk, <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=zR-BTNnarEl">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=zR-BTNnarEl</a>, Can you record this story on the sheet named <a href="story mountain?">story mountain?</a>
- 2 Read 'Why the Rhino has grey skin'. Can you talk through the story as if it was a story mountain? Can you create your own version of a story mountain to show why an animal has a certain feature, i.e. why the giraffe has a long neck, how the tiger earned his stripes... Record your ideas on your own story mountain.
- 3 To write your own 'Tinga Tinga' story based on your own plan.

For the next few weeks we are going to be focusing on the continents. We have already learned a lot about Antarctica during Penguin Week, so this week you could choose to learn about Africa or Australia or both! - You can showcase your learning however you wish!

Here are some ideas to help you to focus your learning or you could come up with a list of your own questions that you want to investigate:

- The Great Barrier Reef is in Australia. Can you create a piece of art work to show what you think it would look like if you went scuba diving there.
- Watch the 'Go Jetters' Funky facts for Africa, and then create your own 'Funky Facts' video for Australia.
- Find out about Aborigine Dreamtime paintings, and create your own using cotton buds and paint.
- Find out more about the animals that live in Africa or Australia. Can you make a fact file about any of them?
- Explore what Australia and Africa are like by using these links on the National Oak Academy.






