Dear Parents and Carers,

Re: Goldsbrough CE Primary Parent questionnaire feedback – March 2021

Thank you to all who have taken the time to complete the survey following a very challenging time in education for everyone.

We are delighted that the feedback is so positive as this reflects the dedication and commitment of the whole staff Team in providing remote learning. Any comments made are also greatly appreciated as they will support us in making necessary adjustments to our provision should we be required to close a bubble, or the school over the coming months.

Please note that these percentages are generated automatically by Parent Mail based on the number of people who answered that particular question. Where parents chose to comment without clicking one of the options available then these do not form part of the percentage.

1. How have you found the quantity of home learning provided?

89.6% of parents/guardian felt that the right amount of home learning had been provided.

2. How have you found the variety of subjects being covered through our home learning?

100% of parents/guardians felt that a good range of subjects were provided.

3. Have the paper packs provided structure to support your child with their learning at home?

100% of parents/guardians (who clicked on a response) felt that the packs provided supported home learning.

4. How did your child respond to the online lessons?

97.6% of parents/guardians felt that their child(ren) were equally or more engaged during this lockdown.

5. My child received useful feedback from their teachers during lessons and/or via TEAMS

100% of parents/guardians felt that their children(ren) received useful feedback all or most of the time.

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6. My child coped well with the amount of work given

97.9% of parents/guardians felt that their child had coped well with the amount of work provided.

7. I felt confident supporting my children at home

94% of parents/guardians felt confident supporting their child all or most of the time.

8. I felt supported by the staff at school

92.6% of parents/guardian felt supported by school staff all or most of the time.

9. I know where I can access wellbeing support for my child(ren) E.g. from letters sent from school and information on the wellbeing page on our school website

92.7% of parents/guardians know where to access wellbeing support for their child.

10. Are you happy with the home learning package provided by school?

100% of parents/guardians were happy with the learning package provided by school all or most of the time.

11. Do you think your child made progress during this lockdown (e.g. learning new subject content/skills and knowledge)?

96.1% of parents/guardians felt their child made progress all or most of the time.
