#### <u>Absences</u>

Please can families make **a phone call each day their child is unwell** and either leave a voicemail or speak to a member of staff. This should be on every day that they are absent. **This can be followed up with an email.** 

This is in case a member of staff needs to ask any supplementary questions – it is part of the commitment to safeguarding to ensure that we are speaking to families about absences and that we have the chance to check in and see if our families require any support or assistance.

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### Safeguarding - Dropping off and picking up

Please can we ask that when you are dropping off and collecting your children during before and after school or during school hours that you use the cricket club car park, the Bay Horse Car Park or park further away from school for on street parking.

School has received several complaints from the residents of the village listed below:

- Cars pulling out without indicating and speeding off out of the village
- Parking opposite a road junction or drive way, preventing residents pulling out safely
- Turning in the road junction into oncoming cars
- Getting children into and out of the car onto the main road with car doors open blocking the way for oncoming traffic

#### URGENT - Information to share with Parents and Staff- Funding Support from the Government

We have funding available through our Health Through Warmth Project to help vulnerable residents with the cost of gas repairs and servicing. <u>This funding must be allocated by the end of February</u> as the scheme finishes end of March, so the information would need to go out as soon as possible.

The funding is available to Homeowners who meet certain income thresholds AND have a relevant health condition as shown below. The applicant would need to find a gas safe registered contractor to do the work if it's outside Scarborough or Ryedale areas as I do not know contractors across other areas.

Anyone who needs a gas repair/boiler service etc and believes they meet the relevant criteria can apply to <u>Choices4Energy.sca@northyorks.gov.uk</u>. Someone will then confirm details with applicants and process an application to the scheme.
