The children were delighted when Mighty Zulu Nation visited – they learned a song in different language and participated in traditional dancing. The children were totally immersed in the culture


– most children had never experienced anything like it before but they enjoyed it so much that they immediately asked 'When will MZN be back?'

World Book Day 2020

We had such an enjoyable day, celebrating World Book Day. Though it is always fun to dress up, we wanted the day to have a real focus on reading to launch our increased curriculum focus on develop the children's vocabulary. One of the main tasks was to be immersed in new vocabulary and be able to rank it as Green.

In lessons, children are thinking about the words they see and must decide if it is red, amber or green:

Red word -

I have never heard of it.

Amber word –
I have heard of it but can't
explain it well.

Green word – Ilike this word and can use it confidently.

During the week, the teachers will discuss the words and the children may complete tasks to help them develop their understanding, moving any red and amber words to green.
