We have continued to have a wonderful time in school in recent weeks and as usual, we have been busy squeezing every drop of fun and excitement out of each day.

It has been so wonderful to welcome so many of you to the Class Assemblies that we have seen so far – the children are always so full of character and really make me laugh with their wit. Their reading has been brilliant and the work that they have been completing so far this term has been full of exciting tasks. Their confidence has truly shone when reading in formation and demonstrating tasks from their learning to our parents.

Did you know that all maintained schools – whether they are a church school or not - must provide religious education as part of the curriculum and daily collective worship for all registered pupils and promote their spiritual, moral and cultural development? At school, we will be putting the tree up next week. Mr Campbell donated two trees – one for school and one for FROGS to raffle to make money for school. How kind!

As part of our Christmas celebrations we will be holding a German Christmas Market on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> December after school).



Each class has been busy developing their Design Technology skills by deciding and making an item which they will sell at the German Market. Each class has been given £30 to spend on resources but their aim is to produce a design which can be sold to raise money for their class to spend. Each child will be able to make one of their chosen item, but the class will also vote for their favourite designs and mass produce these to sell. Other children will be involved in marketing and advertising for the event, visiting other classes to talk about their product; and the finances: working out exactly how much each item costs to make and what would be a good price to sell them for.



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Planning for the annual Nativity is well under way – excitement is bubbling around school and that's just from the teachers. St. Mary's Church is always bursting for the Nativity and will be ticket holders only. A Parentmail letter will be sent out next week to inform the office of your ticket preferences and we appreciate your understanding that there is a limit to 100 tickets per performance. The Nativity will take place on Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> December at 10am and again at 6pm.

I have said it before, and I will say it again – we are SO lucky to have the support of our amazing FROGS who have been purchasing lots of exciting new things for school such as new interactive whiteboards for 3 of the four classes. ### P&A Christmas Lunch

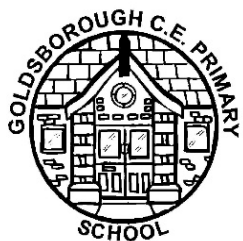

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### **Applications for a Primary School Place for September 2020**

If you live within North Yorkshire and your child was born between **1 September 2015 and 31 August 2016**, your child will be due to start school in the academic year 2020-2021 and you will need to apply for a primary school place for **September 2020**.

Applications can be made from now and must be submitted before **15 January 2020**. **Please also see NYCC letter attached.**

### **Bad Weather Arrangements at Goldsbrough**

We would like to advise/remind everyone of our bad weather and winter arrangements which are outlined below:

- School will endeavour to remain open where possible during the winter months.
- The school would need to close before the school day starts only if staff are not able to make the journey into school, meaning that there would not be enough adults to provide adequate and safe supervision of pupils.
- The school would need to close during the school day only if conditions worsen to such an extent that journeys home for families and for staff would become dangerous.
- Families' journeys to school are diverse, with some walking, some driving from local villages and some driving from further afield. For this reason, we ask that parents/carers take their own decision as to whether it is safe to drive to school on snowy days. If you decide not to make the journey, please inform school via a phone call or email.
- Should school need to close, a text message will be sent to all parents/carers as early as possible. This message will also be posted on the front page of our website ([goldsbroughprimary.co.uk](http://goldsbroughprimary.co.uk)) and broadcast on Stray FM (97.2FM).
- Should school remain open but there is a thick blanket of snow on the ground, the playground entrance nearest the cricket club will remain closed. Pupils are therefore asked to come into school via the middle or village entrance and come straight into school.
